









5.4	<p>Furnish details of the following aspects of curriculum design:</p> <p>Innovation such as modular curricula Inter/multidisciplinary approach</p>	<p>The curriculum for many of the courses has modular design and is following Choice Based Credit System. Students can decide their own pace of learning and register for courses according to their interests and capabilities. In designing curriculum, apart from core subjects, the University offers Programme Electives and Open Electives in domains like Basic Sciences, Management, Business & Commerce, Agriculture Sciences, Computer Application etc. This ensures a well-rounded and balanced curriculum choices including opportunities for the students to explore areas of human and social interest. Courses have interventions from industrial experts also and components of fundamental, design & application etc. are covered appropriately.</p> <p>The curriculum provides the opportunity for students to pursue industrial training. Internship, Projects, seminars and dissertation during their courses of study. It gives them the freedom to go beyond the syllabus and explore a topic of their interest in depth.</p>

If yes, please give details regarding frequency and its usage.	<p>Though there is no formal Academic Audit body constituted at present, all important academic decisions and matters are evaluated by external experts and internal faculty through formal statutory bodies, namely the Academic Council and the Board of Management, constituted as per the University Statutes. These bodies advise on various academic matters, including the introduction of new courses and their implementation strategies.</p> <p>All significant academic decisions and details are discussed, approved, and recorded in the meetings of the Academic Council and the Board of Studies, as per the prescribed norms. Both the Academic Council and the Board of Studies include external representation as per the provisions of the Act and Statutes.</p> <p>In addition, the audit of question papers and schemes by external experts is currently under progress.</p>

A student is evaluated on class/tutorial participation, assignment work, class tests, mid-term tests, quiz, project work, seminars and end term examinations etc. All these contribute to the final grade awarded to the student. Further, answer scripts are shown to the students after evaluation. Grades are also moderated by a Grade Moderation Committee. Tentative grades along with answer script displayed before finalizing the grade. Student's appeal /concern, if any, about tentative grades are considered appropriately by the Grade Moderation Committee.</p> <p><u>Details of the University Ordinance on the Conduct of Examinations are enclosed as Annexure – 5</u></p>

The student's performance is evaluated based on class/tutorial participation, assignment work, class tests, quiz, viva-voce, mid-term examination and end term examination, all of which contribute to the final grade awarded to the students. Major schedule of such exam / evaluation are incorporated in academic calendar provided to all at beginning of semester</p>
5.12	How are the question papers set to ensure the achievement of the course objectives?	<p>The course coordinator / course instructor follows the guidelines for setting up the question papers. They set the question papers in such a manner, so that the objectives set out for the courses are met. The question paper is also moderated by a question paper moderation committee / moderation set up in each Department to ensure course coverage / spread and assessment of level of knowledge acquired. The paper setting process also ensures proper coverage of syllabi and aspect of theory & Practical etc.</p>
5.13	State the policy of the University for the constitution of board of question paper setters, board of examiners and invigilators.	<p>All departments form committees for question paper setting, moderation and evaluation as per the University guidelines, duly approved by Academic Council mentioned as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Question paper setters and question paper moderators are appointed by the HoDs in consultation with the Director of the School / Dean of the Faculty, at the beginning of the semester and sent to the Examination Section. ➤ The Controller of Examinations appoints the Center Superintendent, Deputy Superintendent and independent flying squad for smooth, impartial, safe and secure conduct of examination. ➤ The Departmental Exam Coordinator / Assistant Exam Coordinators are appointed by the HoD in consultation with the Dean/Principal of the College. ➤ Invigilation duties will be assigned by the Exam Coordinator with the approval of HOD in a ratio of 1:30 ratio (i.e. 1 invigilator up to 30 students)(Minimum 2 invigilator in one room) ➤ One Reliever / Assistant exam coordinator may be appointed for 4-6 rooms. The Reliever should be available for the complete duration of the exam. He / she provides the malpractice form or extra answer sheets, if and when needed in the assigned room.




